WE, THE PEOPLE OF INDIA, having solemnly resolved to constitute India into a SOVEREIGN, SOCIALIST, SECULAR DEMOCRATIC REPUBLIC and to secure to all its citizens: JUSTICE, Social, economic and political LIBERTY of thought, expression, belief faith and worship; **EQUALITY** of status and of opportunity: and to promote among them all, FRATERNITY assuring the dignity of the individual and the unity and integrity of the Nation. IN OUR CONSTITUENT ASSEMBLY this twenty - sixth day of November, 1949, do HEREBY ADOPT, ENACT AND

GIVE TO OURSELVES THIS CONSTITUTION.

THE CONSTITUTION OF INDIA Chapter IV A FUNDAMENTAL DUTIES ARTICLE 51 A

Fundamental Duties: It shall be the duty every citizen of India:

- (a) To abide by the Constitution and respect its ideas and institutions, the National Flag and the National Anthem.
- (b) To cherish and follow the noble ideals which inspired our national struggle for freedom.
- (c) To upload and protect the sovereignty, unity and integrity of India.
- (d) To defend the country and render national service when called upon to do so.
- (e) To promote harmony and the spirit of common brotherhood amongst all the people of India transcending religious, linguistic and regional or sectional diversities, to renounce practices derogatory to the dignity of women.
- (f) To value and preserve the rich heritage of our composite culture.
- (g) To protect and improve the natural environment including forests, lakes, rivers, wild life and to have compassion for living creatures.
- (h) To develop the scientific temper, humanism and the spirit of inquiry and reform.
- (i) To safeguard public property and so abjure violence.
- (j) To strive towards excellence in all sphere of individual and collective activity so that the nation constantly rises to higher levels of endeavour and achievement.

School Rules

General:

- 1. Students are required to bring their hand book to the school every day.
- Students should always be neatly dressed with their shoes polished.
 They should have regular hair-cuts. Girls with very short hair should wear a hair band. Those with shoulder length hair should be plaited and tied with rubber band at the end. Nails must be clipped at regular intervals and kept clean.
- 3. The medium of instructions is English. It is obligatory for all to converse in English language in the campus out of the campus where they are on duty.
- 4. Discipline is the first priority of this institution with a firm belief that today's disciplined child is tomorrow's responsible citizen. Polite and courteous behavior is expected from the students at all times.
- 5. Students must bring books according to the time table and the H/W schedule given by the class teachers.
- 6. Valuables like jewellery, mobile phones electronic devices and self-driven vehicles are not permitted at the school.
- 7. Students must get their report cards signed by their parents within two days of the receipt from the school.
- 8. Students will only be allowed to go home early if only along with the parents and the parents have to produce identity cards for picking the children from school.
- 9. Every student must possess an I.D. card all the time during school hours and also during transportation, outside competition & public exam.

Code of Conduct

Behaviour:

Students will carry out their duties in a brisk and smart manner. They are permitted to approach the Principal or higher authorities for requests or making complaints through Class prefects and give suggestions. Silence will be observed in the following places and on the following occasions. Class/House prefects will ensure that strict silence is maintained.

(i) When fallen in for assembly (ii) In the class rooms (iii) In the library (iv) In the dining hall

Conversation will never be loud and disturbing. Voice should be kept low and Students are to address each other in gentle and polite manner.

GENERAL GUIDELINES TO PARENTS/ GUARDIANS

- Parents are requested not to criticize the teachers in the presence of child at home.

- Parents/Visitors can meet the Principal/ Coordinator/Teacher on all Wednesday afternoon. During other days, prior appointment can be obtained by contacting the school reception.
- Parents are requested to bring any particular or specific problem of the child to the notice of the Principal to facilitate prudent counselling and guidance.
- Parents are informed not to take the children home/function during the middle of any working day session, except under unavoidable circumstances.
 Escorts with proper identify cards only will be allowed to pick up the wards.
- Parents are requested to make full use of the free extra remedial classes extended to their wards after school hours or on holidays. In such cases they should make their own arrangements for conveyance.
- Parents are advised not to make the children wear any costly jewellery and not to bring cash, valuable articles, stapler, scissors or sharp instrument to school.
- Parents should not send sweets and gifts for classmates/teachers on the child's birthday. Instead the child can donate books to the school library or bring Saplings for the school garden. Parents should send the child in full school uniform on his/her birthday (for Grade 6 and above). Children from KG to Grade 5 can come in coloured dress on their birthday.
- Parents should not allow students to use 2 wheelers to commute to school.
- We understand that it is unsafe for children to move alone on roads. Keeping
 this in mind, parents are advised to accompany students to and from school
 or advice students to go in groups for safety. Further, parents (of transport
 users) are advised to accompany students to and from the scheduled stops or
 school buses.

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- Students are not allowed to bring cell phones, cameras and other electronic gadgets. If found they will be confiscated.
- Objectionable literature is not allowed into the school. Action will be taken against those guilty of bringing such literature to school.
- Parents are requested not to send pupils suffering from infectious / contagious diseases in the interest of caring other students. Personal cleanliness and hygiene are greatly recommended to all.
- Parents are requested to notify the school if there is any change in their address/phone number.
- Parents are expected to pay their fees before the last date for every term in office.

Class Room:

- a. Students will report to their respective place of call like assembly, class room, study room, dining hall etc., five minutes before the appointed hour.
- b. Late comers are to obtain permission to enter the class room from the Principal/Class teacher/Subject teacher/Games teacher.
- c. The Class prefect is in charge of the class in every respect and is to be obeyed. By any chance a wrong order is issued; the order is first to be obeyed and then a representation made to the Principal/Class teacher as may be deemed necessary.
- d. The class prefect is expected to maintain high order of discipline in the absence of the Teacher and is empowered to take disciplinary action with due information given to the Class teacher.
- e. All the students are expected to speak in English in school.

Admission:

Admission to the school is mainly in LKG, Admission to other classes depends upon the vacancies that arise due to withdrawals. A child seeking admission in LKG should be 3.5 years old on or before 1st of June of the school year.

Every student should produce the birth certificate, Adhar, Community certificate, Transfer certificate, Marks statement of previous class.

Evaluation:

For Grade I to XII the school follows CBSE guidelines and assessment is based on the academic achievements subject enrichment activities etc. For XI& XII monthly tests will be conducted, other than terminal & Final Examinations.

PROMOTION RULES

➤ **Grade 1 to 5:** Will be made on the basis of the total performance in periodical, Cumulative & Final Examinations.

- Frade 6 to 10: will have periodic test & final examinations. The terminal Examinations and final exams cover 100% syllabus which has been covered each term and in the whole year. There will be 80 marks final examination covering full syllabus and the student has to secure 33% for minimum pass. There will be 20 marks internal assessments. Student has to secure 33% out of overall 20 marks earmarked in each subject. This 20 Marks comprise of pen paper (5M), Multiple assessment (5M), Subject enrichment (5M) & Practical/Map Work /Project Work /Portfolio (5M).
- ➤ **Grade 9:** A Student has to score minimum of 33% in each theory & Practical. Students scoring less that 33% has to reappear, in order to be eligible for promotion.

A student who doesn't appear for unit test, Term exam & annual examinations, will be considered to have failed except on account of sickness & subject to direction of the principal. After each exam to progress report of the student should be signed by the parent.

Class X & XII:

Students will take the AISSE & AISSCE examination respectively conduct by the CBSE and the result will be declared by board.

Character and discipline of the child is pre requisite for considering the promotion.

REWARDS:

Academic toppers in each year will be honored on Merit day with Special awards by Management.

> ACHIEVERS AWARD:

GR: I – X: A Score of 'A' in Aggregate in all assessments together upto February.

GR XI – XII- A score of 80% as aggregate.

NB: 1) The Students must be present in all examination/Assessment.

2) Absence on any grounds will not be considered for exemption.

Achievers will be honored with a certificate and their names will be permanently recorded in the achievers Record with the signature against their names.

➤ <u>WITHDRAWAL:</u> With drawl of a student during a school year is not generally allowed .However, if a student is to be withdrawn for reasons beyond the control of the parent /guardian one calendar months' notice must be given. Transfer certificates will not be conducted.

> LEAVE/ABSENCE

A continuous absence for 15 days be liable for removal from the register.

ABSENCE IN TEST PAPERS/EXAMINATIONS:

Absence in examination is not permitted.

However, absence due to medical reasons should be noticed immediately with a leave application supported by a medical certificate from the doctor who is attending.

In all case of absence the result will be prepared as per the regulative norms Re-examinations will not be conducted.

White half sleeves shirt, Dark Navy Blue pinafore with School Monogram, School belt, Tie, ID card, Dark Navy Blue socks with red lines & Black Shoes.

Grade VI to Grade XII:

Dark Navy Blue Pants, White half sleeves shirt ,Dark Navy blue Overcoat with School Monogram, School belt, Tie,ID card, Dark Navy Blue socks with red lines & Black Shoes.

NR:

- Girls hair should be trimmed / well groomed in two plaits or pony tail with (Black Rubber bands and clips) - Regular uniform; (White Rubber bands and white clips)-sports dress.
- Wearing low waist, Jeans, Legging, and Tight fit dresses, etc.. are strictly prohibited in the school.
- Boys hair should be trimmed in a proper way, Hair colouring and other hairstyles are not allowed.
- Nails should be trimmed regularly.
- Applying Kajal, Mehandhi, nail polish, other cosmetics are strictly not allowed.
- Wearing shorts (Black or Navy blue) is compulsory from KG To Grade 5 Girls.

HOUSE SYSTEM:

- To impart a healthy competitive spirit among the students and to inculcate the habit of working together and training in leadership qualities ,an efficient system of 'houses' has been introduced in the school. All the students belong to the house will be guided through the House In-charges (Teachers) assisted by the House Captain and Vice-Captain.
- It is the responsibility of the House in-charges to look after the general progress of her/his wards in curricular& co-curricular activities, conducting morning assembly, discipline & cleanliness of the school.
- All competitions are held house wise .so house loyalties are the strongest.
 A regular record of the pupil's participation and achievement in house activities is recorded and maintained.
- The Merit points were counted and the house which has secured more points will be awarded as 'BEST HOUSE' on Annual day & Sports day.

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GENERAL INFORMATION

Infrastructure and other facilities:

The School has two storeyed pucca concrete building with fully furnished classrooms one aesthetically built main building for KG , Grades I to V and another one for Grade VI to XII. MESSAGES AND ACTIONS TO BE TAKEN BY PARENTS & STUDENTS

COVID-19 is a new virus and we are still learning about how it affects children. We know it is possible for people of any age to be infected with the virus, but so far there have been relatively few cases of COVID-19 reported among children. The virus can be fatal in cases, so far mainly among older people with pre-existing medical conditions.

Know the latest facts Understand basic information about coronavirus disease (COVID-19), including its symptoms, complications, how it is transmitted and how to prevent transmission. Stay informed about COVID-19 through reputable sources such as UNICEF and WHO and national health ministry advisories. Be aware of fake information/myths that may circulate by word-of-mouth or online.

Recognize the symptoms of COVID-19 (coughing, fever, shortness of breath) in your child Seek medical advice by first calling your health facility/provider and then take your child in, if advised. Remember that symptoms of COVID-19 such as cough or fever can be similar to those of the flu, or the common cold, which are a lot more common. If your child is sick, keep them home from school and notify the school of your child's absence and symptoms. Request reading and assignments so that students can continue learning while at home. Explain to your child what is happening in simple words and reassure them that they are safe.

Keep children in school when healthy If your child isn't displaying any symptoms such as a fever or cough it's best to keep them in school – unless a public health advisory or other relevant warning or official advice has been issued affecting your child's school.

Instead of keeping children out of school, teach them good hand and respiratory hygiene practices for school and elsewhere, like frequent handwashing (see below), covering a cough or sneeze with a flexed elbow or tissue, then throwing away the tissue into a closed bin, and not touching their eyes, mouths or noses if they haven't properly washed their hands. Washing hands properly Step 1: Wet hands with safe running water Step 2: Apply enough soap to cover wet hands Step 3: Scrub all surfaces of the hands – including backs of hands, between fingers and under nails – for at least 20 seconds Step 4: Rinse thoroughly with running water Step 5: Dry hands with a clean, dry cloth, single-use towel or hand drier as available

Wash your hands often, especially before and after eating; after blowing your nose, coughing, or sneezing; going to the bathroom/ toilets/latrines and whenever your hands are visibly dirty.

If soap and water are not readily available, use an alcohol-based hand sanitizer with at least 60% alcohol. Always wash hands with soap and water, if hands are visibly dirty.

Help children cope with the stress Children may respond to stress in different ways. Common responses include having difficulties sleeping, bedwetting, having pain in the stomach or head, and being anxious, withdrawn, angry, clingy or afraid to be left alone. Respond to children's reactions in a supportive way and explain to them that they are normal reactions to an abnormal situation. Listen to their concerns and take time to comfort them and give them affection, reassure them they're safe and praise them frequently.

If possible, create opportunities for children to play and relax. Keep regular routines and schedules as much as possible, especially before they go to sleep, or help create new ones in a new environment. Provide age-appropriate facts about what has happened, explain what is going on and give them clear examples on what they can do to help protect themselves and others from infection. Share information about what could happen in a reassuring way.

For example, if your child is feeling sick and staying at home or the hospital, you could say, "You have to stay at home/at the hospital because it is safer for you and your friends. I know it is hard (maybe scary or even boring) at times, but we need to follow the rules to keep ourselves and others safe. Things will go back to normal soon."

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








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
